

Soundscape Report 2023 Highlights

In 2023: 76,513 complaints filed by 356 people

Compared to 2022:

- The total number of complaints increased by 29% while the number of complainants decreased by 9%.
- The number of complaints linked to an aircraft that operated out of an airport other than YUL or YMX increased by 22%. In 2023, 30% of these complaints were linked to an air movement from St-Hubert airport which represents an increase of 54% compared to 2022.

YUL: 75,684 complaints filed by 327 people

- The number of complaints increased by 29% compared to 2022 while the number of complainants decreased by 6%.
- In 2023, 81% of the complaints originated from 5 people.
- In 2023, 20% of air movements were operated with new generation aircraft (A220, A321Neo, B738 Max, Embraer E295). The number of air movements at YUL increased by 12% compared to 2022.
- The areas with the highest number of complainants are Ahuntsic-Cartierville, Saint-Laurent and Villeray-Saint-Michel-Parc-Extension.



Soundscape Report 2023 – Highlights Action Plan

Operations during restricted hours

Reducing off-hours operations is a priority for ADM and much attention is being paid to reducing operations during restricted hours.

A project to modify criteria for operations during restricted hours was presented to the Soundscape Advisory Committee in December and a public consultation on this project will take place in 2024.



Soundscape Report 2023 – Highlights Airside Works

Rehabilitation of the North Runway (06L-24R)

 The North Runway rehabilitation project was completed on December 1st, 2023. The work was spread out over several years and consisted of carrying out the complete rehabilitation of the runway as well as the reconstruction of its taxiways.

In 2023, work generated the runway's closure from March 13 to June 23 and from October 31 to November 10. Wok on taxiways modified runway use in northeasterly winds from September 11 to October 31 and from November 10 to December 1st. In addition to newsletters sent out to inform citizens, detailed information is available on ADM's website in a <u>section on construction work</u>.

Decommissioning of Runway 10-28

• The runway was officially decommissioned on November 30, 2023. The configuration of this runway posed many safety and capacity issues and its vocation was permanently changed to make it a taxiway. ADM held a public consultation on this change (see pages 15-16 for more details on the consultation).





Soundscape Report 2023Ratio Complaints / Movements YUL





Cause of disturbance identified by complainants









Soundscape Report 2023 Runway Closures - YUL

North Runway (06L-24R) – North Dorval, Pointe-Claire, north Saint-Laurent, Ahuntsic-Cartierville

- January to March 13 operational
- From March 13 to June 23 Closed
 - Use of alternative takeoff flight paths
- From October 31 to November 10 Closed
- From November 10 to December 1 Completion of the work on Taxiway B (same impacts as in September/October)
- Short-term closures (this information is displayed on WebTrak)





Soundscape Report 2023 Runway Closures - YUL

South Runway (06R-24L) – South Dorval, south Saint-Laurent, TMR, Villeray-St-Michel-Parc-

Extension, Rosemont-La-Petite-Patrie

January to March 3 – operational

- Between March 3 and 8 Daily closures
- Starting March 8 operational (single runway from March 13 to June 23 and October 31 to November 10)
- Several short-term closures for maintenance work (this information is displayed on WebTrak)

In order to maintain its installations to reliability and safety standards and to ensure the fluidity of operations, ADM is planning to change the vocation of Runway 10-28 to make it a taxiway. The runway will therefore be permanently decommissioned and used only as a taxiway.

Taxiways connect the runways to the main apron which provides access to boarding gates, the de-icing centre and aircraft parking lots.

The configuration of Runway 10-28 poses many safety and capacity issues. It is shorter than the other two runways and has no parallel taxiway. In addition, the runway's orientation is not optimal according to the prevailing winds in the metropolitan area and its length prevents its use for take off and landings of larger aircraft.

Given the issues arising from the configuration of Runway 10-28, its use has decreased over the years. Since 2013, the runway has been closed several months a year and it has not been used after the end of May 2018.

Because this runway has not been used for several years, there will be no change for areas around the airport.




Movements - Commercial / General Aviation 2016-2023








DISTRIBUTION OF AIR MOVEMENTS
YEAR 2023, BY AIRCRAFT TYPE




Jets – includes heavy aircraft (Airbus, Boeing) and small jets (Embraer, CRJ)




Reasons One-Time Exemptions 2023
