Montréal, December 19, 2013 – Montréal–Trudeau airport is proud to mark the opening of new commercial zones in the public and international areas of the terminal building. These spacious, well-lit and comfortable locations will provide passengers and people accompanying them with an even more diversified choice of retail stores and restaurants.

At the newly opened **Tristan, Cirque du Soleil, Découvrir Montréal, The Source** and **Relay** shops, passengers and members of the public can treat themselves to a gift or complete their Holiday shopping before departure. Shopping options have also been enhanced in the international jetty, with the new **Montréal Duty Free** boutique, fully reimaged in a contemporary style and local design and offering an even broader array of quality brands and products.

Airport users will soon have a more expansive choice of delicious food options as well, with new restaurants set to open in the coming weeks. Joining the existing eateries in the terminal will be **Archibald**, a microbrew pub renowned for its range of beers and original menu items; **Café Vasco da Gama**, designed by Carlos Ferreira, with its one-of-a-kind bar-terrace concept; **Vino Volo**, a new wine and tapas bar; **Les Délices de l'Érable**, a “bistro-boutique” featuring a wide range of maple-based and other local products; and the always enticing **Jugo Juice** and **Sushi Shop**.

With these additions, Montréal–Trudeau now boasts more than 90 stores and restaurants—an offer that is as diversified as it is unique, as many of these new retailers are not to be found in any other airport.

In addition to the commercial enhancements, newly installed media walls in the public area and along the international jetty will make access to information for passengers easier. Interactive displays will also be introduced soon at various locations in the terminal, providing passengers with flight schedules, wait times at the security screening checkpoints, walking times to the gates, a map of the terminal and other useful information.

With these more welcoming spaces and media tools enabling better planning of the airport experience, people accompanying travellers can now spend more time with passengers on the first part of their trip, and enjoy some precious moments together before wishing them *bon voyage!*
