AÉROPORTS DE MONTRÉAL PARTICIPATES IN NATIONAL TREE DAY

Montréal, September 25, 2013— Aéroports de Montréal (ADM) is proud to take part in National Tree Day by contributing to *Opération Monarques II* — the restoration and naturalization of the Parc Marcel-Laurin woodland, located in St. Laurent.

The Parc Marcel-Laurin woodland is an urban island of greenery that provides visitors with the opportunity to increase their contact with nature. ADM's contribution will enable the planting of milkweed to encourage the reproduction and feeding of monarch butterflies, now an endangered species in Canada. An additional 125 trees and 150 shrubs will be planted to remediate a 1.57-hectare area that has been overrun by buckthorn, an invasive species of plant.

This is ADM's third contribution toward the Parc Marcel-Laurin woodland, nearly 1000 have been planted since 2009. As part of its tree policy, which seeks to protect areas of high ecological value on airport lands and to offset the environmental impacts of the Corporation's projects.

ADM is the local airport authority responsible for the management, operation and development of Montréal-Trudeau and Montréal-Mirabel international airports under a lease signed with Transport Canada in 1992. The Corporation employs 625 people at both airports and at head office. ADM has been ISO 14001 certified since 2000 and BOMA BEST certified since 2008.
