**MONTRÉAL–TRUDEAU AIRPORT:
TIPS FOR TRAVELLERS DURING THE SPRING BREAK**

Montréal, February 29, 2012 –Aéroports de Montréal (ADM) would like to offer some helpful tips to people travelling during the spring break period.

Baggage preparation

To facilitate and speed up the check-in process, travellers should verify with their airline the number, size and weight of baggage permitted. ADM also recommends that they visit Canadian Air Transport Security Authority (CATSA) website at www.catsa-acsta.gc.ca to check what items are allowed in the aircraft cabin.

Restrictions on carrying liquids, aerosols and gels in the cabin are still in force. These must be in containers of 100 ml/100 grams or less, and carried in a single clear, closed, resealable plastic bag no larger than 1 litre in capacity.

Before leaving for the airport

Travellers should check the status of their flight either by visiting ADM website at www.admtl.com or the mobile version of the site, via SMS by texting the flight number to 23636, or by contacting their airline.

Access to the airport and parking

Because of the major re-engineering work underway on the roads network in the vicinity of the airport, the routes for accessing the various parking facilities have been changed; it is important to carefully observe the signage. For trips lasting a week or more, ADM recommends that travellers use the EconoParc parking lot.

ADM is the local airport authority responsible for the management, operation and development of Montréal–Trudeau and Montréal–Mirabel international airports since 1992.
